VI. IMPORTANT EVENT INFORMATION

1. ARRIVAL PROCEDURES

a. CIC3*-W Horses

Horses **must** arrive between **10:00 to 4:00 pm, Friday 7th May** - Horses will **not** be accepted outside these hours.

On arrival

- a) Proceed to secretary's office to receive rider information pack including stable wrist bands - put on wrist band
- b) Proceed to stable manager (will be located next to vets) to get stable allocation.
- c) Put horse into stable (wrist band must be worn)

Horses **must** depart **Sunday 9th May** between **4:00pm** and **8:00pm**. No horses will be allowed to stable on Sunday night unless prior arrangements have been made.

b. FEI World Cup Jumping Horses must arrive by no later than 10:00am Saturday 8th May and stay on site until completion of the competition.

c. All other Horses

Horses in the eventing classes (prelim to CIC**) and show jumping (1.20m to 1.40m) classes other than World Cup qualifiers are **NOT** required to stable their horses over night during the competition.

Those horses that are using the stables **MUST** arrive **between 10-4pm Friday 7th May or no earlier than 6am Saturday 8th May**. No horses will be allowed to stable on Sunday night

For competitors arriving before the venue opens, stabling can be arranged at various equestrian centres within 30 minutes of the venue – please contact Rose Read on 0418 216 364.

2. STABLES

Size of boxes, 3.6 m x 3.6 m

Stables must be cleaned out by all riders on departure

Stables must be vacated Sunday afternoon / evening

a) CIC3* - W Stabling requirements

CIC3* - W horses **MUST** stay on site from Friday to completion of the competition on Sunday.

CIC3* - W Horses and those rider's other horses will be stabled in a secure area with wristbands for this area to be provided. Horses for the FEI World Jumping qualifier will also be stabled in this area.

Stabling and bedding for **CIC3* - W** horses **ONLY** is free, and includes 4 bales of sawdust, however the standard stable cleaning bond will still be required.

Each **CIC3*-W** rider will receive the following passes

- 2 passes per rider
- 1 groom's pass per horse
- 2 authorised owners' passes per horse
- 1 trainer's pass, must be authorised by respective NF per rider
- 1 veterinarian, authorised by respective NF per horse

All other riders will receive:

- 3 event/stable passes per horse entered for rider, groom and owner.
- Additional Event Passes (no stable access) are available to riders at a reduced fee of \$15 per person per event (50% discount).

3. BRIDLE NUMBERS

All CIC3*-W, CIC2* & CIC1* horses must wear a bridle number issued by the organising committee whenever being moved around stables, practice, grazing and arenas.

6. ICE

Cold water will be provided for cooling horses at the cross country finish. However If riders require ice at the finish, they must make their own arrangements to have this available. Ice must be ordered and paid for at the secretary's office by 6 pm Friday 7 May. Cost is \$6/bag.

11. OVERSEAS RIDERS COMPETING IN THE CIC3*- W

The Organising Committee will cover the following costs for any overseas riders for the period 7 May to 9 May:

- Accommodation in shared cabins located on site for rider and groom (note one groom per horse) – 2 beds per cabin linen will be provided, please bring towels)
- Requests for accommodation for grooms must be sent with entries.
- Meals for rider and groom, meal vouchers will be provided for the duration.
- Stabling and bedding for horse (Includes 4 bales of sawdust).
- Local Travel from airport to SIEC of horse, rider and groom.

12. OBJECTIONS/COMPLAINTS (Art. 167 & 171)

All complaints to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150 (Swiss Francs) or equivalent.(approx AUD\$200)

13. INSURANCES

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad and to keep the policy up to date.

14. EVENTING MEDICAL CARD

All competitors must supply medical information during the entry process and carry readily accessible medical armbands on themselves a medical card for the Cross - Country Test. Armbands may be checked by the OC upon arrival to the competition by the athletes and checked by the Official Doctor and the Technical Delegate for accurate information.

VII. VETERINARY ASPECTS

1. WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The following Code of Conduct was elaborated by the FEI for all people involved in the welfare of competing horses. The purpose is to ensure the health and welfare

of horses participating under FEI Rules and Regulations and protecting the good image of the equestrian sport. To achieve the widest possible publicity it must be included in the **Schedules** and it is recommended that it also be included in the **Programmes** of all major international events.

CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. *At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.*
2. *Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.*
3. *Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.*
4. *Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.*
5. *The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.*

2. VETERINARY ASPECTS / ISSUES

2.1 VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & "Rules for Eventing" **Art. 518.1 for CCIs and 518.2 for CICs.**

Art. 511.2.2

Every horse entered for any competition at CCNs, CICs 2/1* or CCIs 2/1* in a foreign country (GRs Art. 141.2), and all horses entered for CICs 3*, CCIs 4/3*, CCIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries, must have an official valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 511.2.3

Horses taking part in CCNs, CICs 2/1* or CCIs 2/1* in the country in which they are resident are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned Paragraph 2.2. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

2.2 SAMPLING PROCEDURE FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES (Vet. Regs, Ch. V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCIs 4/3*, CCIOs, World Cup™ Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CCIs/CICs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

3. CUSTOM FORMALITIES & HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

3.1 CUSTOM FORMALITIES

Not applicable for horses from AUS or NZL.

Details of required customs documents, border crossing points, times of opening and customs agencies.

NFs holding an international event in their country should inform their National Veterinary Authority and their Customs Authority at least four weeks beforehand. They should request every facility to assist the movement of horses accompanied by FEI Passports, and the necessary veterinary certification at frontier crossing points into and out of their countries. (Vet. Regs. Art. 1004.2)

1. QUALIFICATIONS

Each NF must certify the qualification of each horse and athlete and list the competitions which enabled horse and athlete to qualify, according to the qualification procedure established for each star level. Please include the relevant procedure according to level of event in schedule (refer to Part B attached and Rules for Eventing Art. 506).

1.1. Principles

In order to compete at an international event, a athlete and horse must have obtained a Qualifying Result (QR) at a number of events at a lower level.

The requirements are laid out below. With the approval of the FEI and their own NF, OCs may impose additional qualifications for horses and/or athletes, which must be published in the schedule.

1.2. Qualifying Result (QR)

A Qualifying Result (QR) is achieved by completing a competition within minimum parameters of all round performance. As follows:

- Dressage Test: not more than 75 penalty points;
- Cross - Country Test: From 2009 onwards, the results at obstacles at International events need to include, where applicable, a minimum of one clear round at a CIC and maximum 20 penalties at a CCI.
- Not more than 90 seconds exceeding the optimum time in the Cross. At 4* events, the maximum time by which the optimum time may be exceeded is 120 seconds; and
- Jumping Test: not more than 16 penalties at obstacles.

1.3. Certification of Qualification for Events

- 1.3.1. All NFs, including the host nation, are responsible to certify that athletes and horses entered by them in international events are correctly qualified in accordance with all the requirements of the Rules.
- 1.3.2. All qualifying events must be identified, and any national events must be certified as of at least the equivalent standard of difficulty as the relevant international star level of competition.
- 1.3.3. The Technical Delegate or his nominee shall check that all horses and athletes starting at all International events are properly certified as qualified by their NF or duly exempted in accordance with this article.

1.4. Qualifying Period and Deadline

- 1.4.1 QRs for CICs must be obtained in the calendar year in question or the 2 preceding calendar years.
- 1.4.2 A QR at a CIC must be obtained at least 10 days before the event for which it is needed.
- 1.4.3 Qualifications may be achieved as a combination or separately by athlete and horse.
- 1.4.4 Where a QR at a CIC is specified, one QR at a CCI of the same level is equally acceptable.

1.5. Required minimum Qualifying Results (QRs) for CIC

CIC / CICO	
1 *	Horses and Athletes must be certified as competent to take part by their NF
2 *	Minimum 1 MER required: 1x CIC 1* or 1x CNC 2*
3 *	Minimum 2 MER required: 1x CIC 2* <u>plus</u> 2x CIC 2* or 1x CNC 3*

In order to move up a level, and **as of 15 April 2009** CICs results of the international qualifying results must be clear on the Cross Country (no XC obstacles penalties).
